The current internationalization strategy has entered into force in April 2016 till April 2020.

The strategy has two main focus areas:

The first focus are students, incoming and outgoing. In both cases, the students benefit from intercultural exchanges and have the opportunity integrate them self.

The second focus is the academic and administrative staff of universities. The exchange of staff creates opportunities for higher education practitioners, to get acquainted with practices and to exchange experiences, in order to standardize whether the teaching and university services.
