


Erisa Kushta

University of Elbasan "Aleksandër Xhuvani" is going to take part in a new Eit-funded project for boosting innovation and entrepreneurship

The University of Elbasan "Aleksandër Xhuvani" is happy to announce that it will be taking part in a new project called HEI4FUTURE. The project aims to transform technological

capabilities into new skills in order to create new products and services in collaboration with various industries. HEI4Future is going to be achieved through a wide range of activities to promote entrepreneurship (training workshops for teachers and educational staff, students, managers, and new entrepreneurs), workshops for teambuilding, direct support through mentoring or coach networks, and mobility programs to promote synergies between teams of entrepreneurs. The project will receive funding from the EIT HEI Initiative: Innovation Capacity Building for Higher Education. This initiative of the European Institute of Innovation and Technology (EIT) aims to boost the entrepreneurial and innovation capacity of higher education institutions (HEIs) across Europe. Under the EIT HEI Initiative, the project will receive funding of €55.000, and it will run until December 2022, with the possibility of getting extended for 18 more months. The EIT HEI Initiative is a key objective for the European Institute of Innovation and Technology as part of its new strategy. The initiative aims to support HEIs with expertise and coaching, access to the EIT innovation ecosystem, the largest in Europe, and funding, enabling them to develop innovation action plans complementing the needs of individual HEIs.

Our Projects

This is the EIT HEI Initiative's second call for proposals, following the success of the 2021 Pilot Call. So far, the initiative has provided funding for nearly 50 projects. The next call for proposals is expected towards the end of 2022.

About the EIT

The EIT strengthens Europe's ability to innovate by powering solutions to pressing global challenges and by nurturing entrepreneurial talent to create sustainable growth and skilled jobs in Europe. The EIT is an EU body and an integral part of Horizon Europe, the EU Framework Programme for Research and Innovation. The Institute supports dynamic pan-European partnerships, EIT Knowledge and Innovation Communities, among leading companies, research labs and universities

Our Projects



Higher Education – Enterprise platform for fostering, modernisation and sustainable growth in natural stone industry in Western Balkans

BKSTONE project has the main objective of fostering the modernization and development of the stone sector in Western Balkans partner countries through strengthening the relationship between the higher education institutions and the industry, and internationalizing curriculum and methods. To meet the requirements of current international demand of natural stone products according to EU standards, the partner countries industry has to perform important changes in quarrying methods, processing methods, quality controls following European and international standards (p.e. CE marking, ASTM, etc.), marketing strategies, international trade, e-commerce etc. These changes require the participation of all local agents, including the Higher Education Institutions (HEI) and Vocational Education and Training (VET) organizations, which should develop their training strategies to meet the challenges explained in the rationale of our project in terms of quality, delivery and especially relevance, in response to the industry needs. The specific objectives of the project to achieve the main goals are:

- To contribute through the outputs of the project to develop National/Regional innovation strategies for specialization in the natural stone sector.
- To put in value each country/region's strengths, competitive advantages and potential for excellence in the stone sector through benchmarking existing training initiatives and incorporating elements into the educational materials to be developed in the project.
- To support technological, as well as practice-based innovative training based on the approach and format of the courses to be developed.
- To contribute to get stakeholders in the stone industry fully involved, encouraging their participation in the conception and testing phases of the development of materials.
- To promote among students active and constructive learning as a necessary means to work in the stone sector, testing new possibilities in partner countries like Tertiary VET levels.
- To create a network platform involving Stone Sector representatives, High Education Institutions (HEI) and VET organizations of EU programme and Partner Countries based on the full implementation of the project

Erasmus+ Days 2021

The "Erasmus+ Days 2021" held at the activity was Faculty of Economics. The activity dedicated to the EUfunded capacity-building projects informed on the products, results, and funding realized from the completed projects, as well as promoted the objectives and goals of the projects currently being implemented. 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
University of Elbasan participates in the EU4Education Fair

The University of Elbasan "Aleksandër Xhuvani" became part of the Erasmus+ program in 2014 with the project KA107, which enables student mobility for all three study cycles (Bachelor, Master, and Doctorate, for studies and internships) and staff mobility (teaching, training, and scientific research) and has 50 agreements in force with partner universities. The University of Elbasan, "Aleksandër Xhuvani" has been and is part of many different projects with the Erasmus+ Program, starting with Tempus, Erasmus CapacityBuilding Mundus, in Higher Education (CBHE), and Jean Monet. UE is with different collaborating partner universities for the connection of new mobility agreements and the different projects that are in the Erasmus+ program.
